STATE ATTENDANCE COUNT DATES <i>Failure to attend school on count dates could result in the state voiding your open enrollment status.</i>	September 16, 2022 and January 13, 2023 On these dates, the Wisconsin Department of Instruction requires all schools to verify attendance of students. All students will need to log on and complete one lesson in each class. It is imperative that each student is “counted” by the State of Wisconsin.
TESTING SCHEDULE <i>Failure to take the state-required tests could result in dismissal from WVA. Dates T.B.D.—Held on various dates in months of March—May</i>	Students enrolled in WVA in grades 6-11 are required to participate in Wisconsin’s standardized testing. WVA is required by state and federal law to administer these tests. A major responsibility of students and parents is to make certain students take these tests as directed. Testing takes place in the months of March-May on various days. Students typically only have to come in for 1 or 2 days and we will send details as it gets closer. Testing is held in person in Wauwatosa.
